

DLC Campus Usage Policy as of 09/01/2020

With the new CA state guidelines released this week the church council has approved this update to the campus usage policy.

The campus is closed with the following exceptions:

Staff and individual members may enter the buildings. Groups and events are not permitted in the buildings. To make others aware of people on campus please sign up for a time and space you or your group (outside only) will be occupying while on campus. No one is required to be on campus. The signup is available in the weekly blast, the website, or calling the church office.

Outdoor events including worship may occur on the campus under the following:

- The event be posted on the signup sheet with the space usage listed and the number of attendees permitted by the group sponsoring and leading the event. (i.e. worship committee, social ministry committee, property committee, confirmation, Sunday School)
- If you are sick do not attend. If you have been with someone who is sick do not attend.
- [All state and county guidelines must be followed.](#) These include but are not limited to wearing appropriate masks and maintaining physical distancing, posting required signage and spacing while on campus.
- [A waiver must be signed and filed for each participant.](#) The waiver is kept on file for future referencing and is renewed yearly.
- Participants bring their own seating chairs, blankets, umbrellas. Any church equipment that is used requires sanitary cleaning.
- If restrooms are to be opened and used, they require cleaning by the group: surfaces, handles, light switches, etc., any surface that may have been used. Cleaning must occur after any individual use of the restroom.
- Hand sanitizer, surface cleaner and disposable gloves will be provided by the church.
- Drive in events do not require a waiver when participants remain in their cars.

It is the purpose of these church guidelines to make the campus safely available to members for their ministries. They are subject to change at any time to comply with state and county guidelines and manageable protocols by the congregation.
